SWDSI Lifetime Achievement Award

David E. Douglas, PhD



David Douglas, Emeritus Professor, has been an active member of Decision Sciences and Southwest Decision Sciences (SWDSI) since 1985. He retired August 2017 after 42 years on faculty with the University of Arkansas with his initial appointment in Industrial Engineering in 1975. He moved to what is now the Information Systems Department in 1978 and served as Department Chair from 1985 to 1997 and again as interim Department Chair in 2010. The Department implemented its PhD program and its Master of Information Systems program during his time as Department Chair. Dr. Douglas relished teaching, working with industry and applied research. He has taught in 5 different countries—Australia, China, France, Greece, and Vietnam. He is the recipient of several teaching and service awards. As Director of Enterprise Systems, he was instrumental in obtaining gifts in kind in excess of \$200 million from Enterprise Systems platform partners - IBM, Microsoft, SAP, Teradata and SAS. He received IBM Faculty Awards in 2007 and 2013 and Teradata Pioneer Award in 2017. Publications have appeared in various journals including Communications of the ACM, Decision Sciences Journal of Innovative Education, Ethics and Behavior, the Journal of Business Ethics, the Journal of Computer Information Systems, the Journal of Organizational and End User Computing, Information and Management, and the Journal of Management Information Systems, as well as international, national and regional Proceedings of various Conferences.

David has been active in the Decision Sciences Institute DSI and Southwest Decision Sciences Institute as well as the Federation of Business Disciplines (FBD) since 1986. He has served in many capacities including President of SWDSI in 1996-97 and President of FBD in 2004-2005. He is the recipient of the SWDSI Outstanding Educator of the Year award in 2000 and the FBD Sam Bruno Lifetime Achievement Award in 2012. David continues to be involved with FBD and SWDSI focusing on data analytics.

Dr. Douglas received his PhD in Industrial Engineering from the University of Arkansas. He teaches in a wide variety of information systems areas with emphasis on data analytics, data mining, business intelligence, enterprise systems, and global IT. Research includes impact of data analytics and cognitive computing. He has taught in several countries and presents workshops worldwide. He has received a number of honors and awards including International Educator of the year (IACIS), 2010 Majdi Najm Outstanding Service Award (SAP University Alliances), IBM International Professor of the month, two IBM faculty awards and NSF co-principal investigator for Enterprise Computing Community. In addition to the Co-Director and Director positions at the University of Arkansas, Douglas serves on the Executive Committee of the Information Technology Research Institute as well as serving on the Teradata University Network Board, the SAP University Alliances Board and on the Editorial Board of the Journal of Global Communications. His work with industry partners' results in hardware/software gifts valued at more than \$20 million dollars annually.

The Federation of Business Disciplines (FBD) – a 21st century designation for its organizational primogenitor, the Southwestern Federation of Administrative Disciplines (SWFAD) – has developed into one of the largest annual meetings for those disciplines common to business administration.

SWFAD was an outgrowth of the business disciplines in the Southwestern Social Science Association (SSA). The founders of SWFAD met in Dallas, Texas, April of 1973 and defined the purposes of SWFAD: (1) to foster professional development in each of the academic disciplines common to business administration, (2) to provide an annual meeting in the Southwest for each of the academic disciplines and (3) to provide a common general program in which all the disciplines participate together.

Eight disciplinary groups founded SWFAD. They were the Academy of Management, Southwest Division (now Southwest Academy of Management), American Accounting Association (Southwest Region), American Business Communication Association, Southwest Region (now Association for Business Communication, Southwest Region), American Institute for Decision Sciences, Southwest Region (now Decision Sciences Institute, Southwest Region), Southern Regional Business Law Association, Southwestern Business Administration Association (later Southwestern Business Dean's Association), Southwestern Finance Association, and the Southwestern Marketing Association (now Association of Collegiate Marketing Educators).

At the first annual meeting held in Dallas in March of 1974, the Southern Case Research Association (now Southwest Case Research Association) was admitted to membership. Successive disciplines were affiliated: Southwestern Society of Economics (1975), Southwestern Small Business Institute Association (1976) (later Association for Small Business and Entrepreneurship), and the Southwest Administrative Services Association (1979) (now Association of Business Information Systems). In 1989 the Board of Directors voted to permit the Academy of International Business, Southwest, to meet with the 1990 session. This discipline was admitted to membership in 1991. In 2004 the Industrial Distribution Educator's Association asked to meet with FBD as a guest association, and in 2005 the Organizational Systems Research Association also asked to meet with FBD as a guest association. From 2008 to 2015, FBD met with 10 associations. In 2015, the Academy of International Business, Southwest withdrew from the Federation of Business Disciplines.

Executive Director

Sam J. Bruno served as the Executive Director of the Association from 1982-2009. Betty Kleen was selected as Executive Director in 2009 and held the position until May of 2012. Michelle McEacharn assumed the role of Executive Director on June 1, 2012.






